## 1 Point Perspective (Interior)

OBJECTIVE

MATERIALS • 19 " $\times 24$ " drawing paper

- ruler
- plastic triangle
- graphite pencil
- eraser

GRADING 20 points ( 5 points for timely completion +5 points for following directions 5 points for neatness in execution +5 points for accurate use of perspective)

INSTRUCTIONS 1) We began drawing an interior space in class using 1 Point Perspective. You will finish your drawing at home by completing what you have started. Before you leave class check to see if you have three types of lines: 1) horizontal lines, 2) vertical lines and 3 ) lines that converge on the vanishing point. These are the lines that will create a sense of depth in your drawing. Some details (like furniture) will require other lines that don't fall into one of these categories.
2) Your drawing should include all of the following: 1) an ellipse (a circular table or a column, for example); 2) stairs (these may numbers as few as three); 3) a window, 4) a door and, finally, 5) at least one object that is drawn using 2 Point Perspective (such as a table in the center of the room). You are encouraged to be creative and add whatever else you would like.
3) Do not add shading to the drawing.
